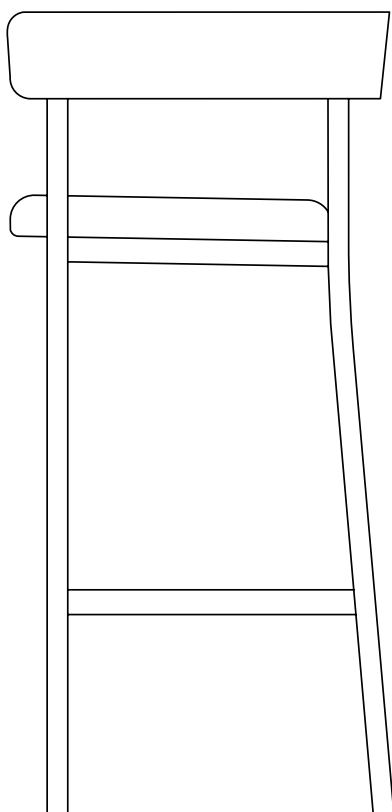


## Description

The “Font” collection is a family of chairs, lounge chairs, barstools and sofas – available with or without armrests. The name of the collection refers to graphic fonts that inspire the varying thickness of the cushion and backrest.

### Overview of materials

### Recycling instructions

---

Unscrew the backrest from the frame, using the screws under the backrest.

Unscrew the seat from the frame, using the screws underneath the seat.

Use a scissor or knife to cut open the upholstery, and pull it off the seat and backrest.

The foam can now be easily pulled from the metal frame of the backrest, and the plywood of the seat. The materials are sorted and recycled using the instructions at the recycling facility.

### Frame

---

To clean, simply wipe with a soft cloth using lukewarm water. Avoid the use of chemical cleaners.

### Textile upholstery

---

In general remove non-greasy stains by carefully dabbing with a lint-free cloth or sponge wrung out in clean lukewarm water. If necessary, clean by dabbing with soapy water. Finally, dab the surface with clean water. Finish by soaking up the moist from the upholstery using a clean dish towel and make sure it won't dye off and finish using a hairdryer.

### Sheepskin

---

In general sheepskin does not require maintenance, its natural content of lanolin makes it almost resistible against dirt. Lanolin is the natural defense of the wool against dirt, it is therefore not recommended using cleaning devices with perfume or other chemicals, since it will remove the lanolin in the wool. If liquids or food is spilled on the wool, it is recommended to let it dry and afterwards vacuum. If the stain still occurs, it can be washed with a semi wet cloth and afterwards brushed out.

Avoid placing furniture with wool upholstery in direct sunlight as color changes in the wool may occur.

### Leather

---

Avoid placing the leather in direct sunlight or extreme heat. To absorb any spills, use a clean, dry cloth immediately. To dush, use a vacuum cleaner with a soft brush regularly.

Clean using the foam from soap flakes for house cleaning. Use a ½ decilitre of soap flakes to a litre of water. Whip the soap flakes into hot water. When the water becomes room temperature, the foam must be applied all over the leather with a soft cloth. Only use the foam and avoid soaking the leather. When the leather is dry, polish it with a soft, dry cotton cloth. Never use detergents, ammonia, oils, polish, varnish etc.
