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Sillon SH7 by Sebastian Herkner

Originating in France in the '20s, the Art Deco style was characterized by a streamlined look, curved accents, and geometric motifs. With such principles in mind, German designer Sebastian Herkner created Sillon, a set of striking mirrors that reference the elegance of this bygone age within a modern context.

"I wanted to create a mirror that examined the interplay between the brilliance of the reflection and the subdued pattern along the edges," Herkner explains of his design process. Named after the French word for 'groove,' the Sillon boasts subtle detailing along the plated steel frame, which is then finished in brass or chrome.

A new addition to the series is a full-length rectangular mirror. With a height of 190cm, this large mirror adds a focal point of interest to any interior.

Named designer of the year at Maison&Objet in Paris in 2019, Herkner has quickly established himself as a formidable creative force. After graduating from the University of Art and Design in Offenbach, an apprenticeship with Stella McCartney triggered his fascination with form, textural effects, and colour - key elements which define his work today.

German designer Sebastian Herkner transposes contemporary objects into cultural artefacts and visa versa, channelling his appreciation of authentic materials and artisan skills combined with modern technology. After graduating from the University of Art and Design in Offenbach, Herkner's apprenticeship with Stella McCartney in London triggered his fascination with form, structure, texture, material and effects, evident in all of his work - including even the smallest of details.
